Prayers for Morning Worship – 15th to 19th May

Theme for the week – Feast of the Ascension

When Jesus ascended into heaven, according to the gospel account, he returned to his father to sit at his right hand in glory until the end of time. But he also promised not to leave us like orphans. He remains with us, more closely now because he is not just physically present in the world any longer: no space or time separates us from him. He is the Lord of all creation, and guides everything to fulfilment in the kingdom of God. In preparation of the feast of the Ascension, we pray for the power of God's Spirit to fill out hearts and minds so that we can do his will and carry on the work of the Gospel.
