Curriculum Aims



All students are entitled to a curriculum that:

- provides a range of learning experiences of the highest possible standards that is rich, varied and which challenges, inspires and motivates
- enables all students to fulfil their potential, irrespective of their intellectual development, background, age, gender, disabilities, culture or race
- meets individual needs through differentiated programmes of study in each subject, where possible
- includes religious education and collective worship
- equips them with skills, knowledge, sense of responsibility and experiences to prepare them for life after school, including the use of key skills of literacy, numeracy, communication, information technology and study skills
- prepares them to lead constructive and fulfilling lives
- furthers the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of students and helps them to be free from prejudice and sensitive to the needs of others. This includes growing within our students an understanding of and support for equality, diversity and inclusivity in relation to a range of differences, including race, ethnicity, gender, and disability.
- develops cross-curricular elements, including relationship and sex education, citizenship and environmental awareness through the delivery of the PSHE programme
- develops their personal creativity and aesthetic awareness
- fosters a willingness to contribute to the work of the school and to the wider community
- enables students to develop their self-esteem, self-discipline and self-motivation through continuous self-assessment and evaluation
- ensures continuity and progression.
