and stand in special need of Your forgiveness.

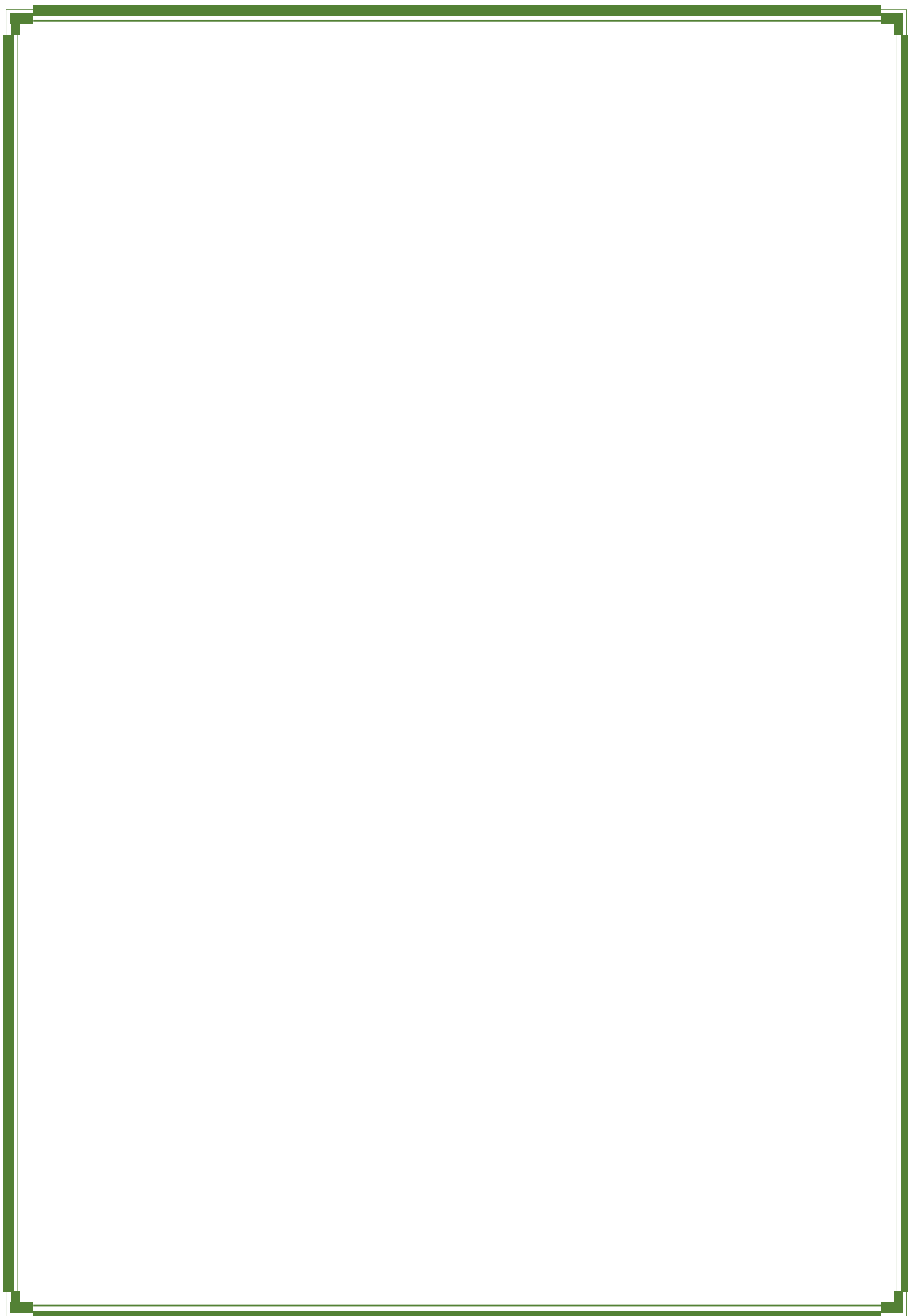
