### Theme for the week – Prayers for the Week of Christian Unity

O Lord God, the one God, make your people one. Whatever our differences, even in matters essential, may we ever realise that we are one in Jesus Christ. We pray that your Holy Spirit will so guide and direct our hearts to unite with our brothers and sisters.

Eternal God, look mercifully on the broken body of your church. Draw its members to you and to one another by the bonds of your love; that its restored unity may bring healing to the nations and the life of mankind may glorify you, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

(New Every Morning)

“Christ is like a single body which has many parts. It is still one body even though it is made up of different parts. In the same way all of us...have been baptised into one body by the same spirit and we have all been given the one spirit to drink. For the body itself is not made up of one part but of many parts. If the foot were to say, ‘because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body’, that would not keep it from being part of the body. If an ear were to say, ‘because I am not an eye I don’t belong to the body’, that would not keep it from being part of the body. If the whole body were just an eye how could it hear? If it were only an ear how would it smell? As it is however, God put every part in the body just as he wanted it to be. There would not be a body if it were all only one part! As it is, there are many parts but one body”.

(1 Corinthians 12: 12 – 20)

O God, whose will it is that all your children should be one in Christ; we pray for the unity of your Church. Pardon all our pride and our lack of faith, of understanding and of charity, which are the causes of our divisions. Deliver us from narrow mindedness, from our bitterness, from our prejudices. Save us from considering as normal that which is a scandal to the world and an offence to your love.

Why must we be so cut off from each other at the moment when we should be sharing you? This should be the time when we are closest together but it is now that I know most deeply the agony of separation. Lord, if it breaks my heart in this way how much more must it break yours? We love each other and we love you. Why must we be separated at this feast of love and union? Lord, make it possible for us to worship together in complete union and fellowship, and show us what we must do to bring this about!
