Prayers for Morning Worship – 27th June to 1st July

Theme for the week – Prayers for Feast of St Peter & St Paul

St Peter and St Paul are linked together in the Roman Catholic Church. Peter, once called Simon, was appointed leader of the apostles by Jesus. But he was often rash and denied Jesus at the passion. Even so, after the resurrection Jesus asked him three times for his love.

Paul was a Jew who at first persecuted the Church, but was converted when travelling to Damascus.

Both are seen as great protectors of the faith of the church. And we can say that the church is founded on them.

St Paul is honoured as patron of public relations and St Peter is patron of fishermen.
