These new opportunities provide the same university study as the traditional student routes but are combined with work-based learning, as an employee with a salary and no student debt. Add to these the opportunity to qualify as social workers, physiotherapists and paramedics, whilst working and gaining experience and you can see that it's a great time to take a fresh look at careers available in healthcare.

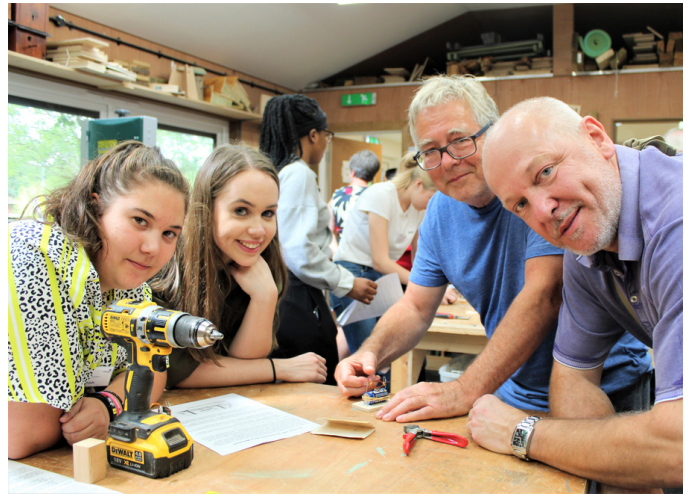


## What will happen on the course?

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- To understand the values and principles which underpin excellent health and social care
- To identify the key tasks of health and social care professionals who work in end of life care
- To be able to identify the main themes of end of life care in a hospice setting
- To learn about health and care from a patient perspective
- To put death and dying on the map – getting comfortable with the language and themes
